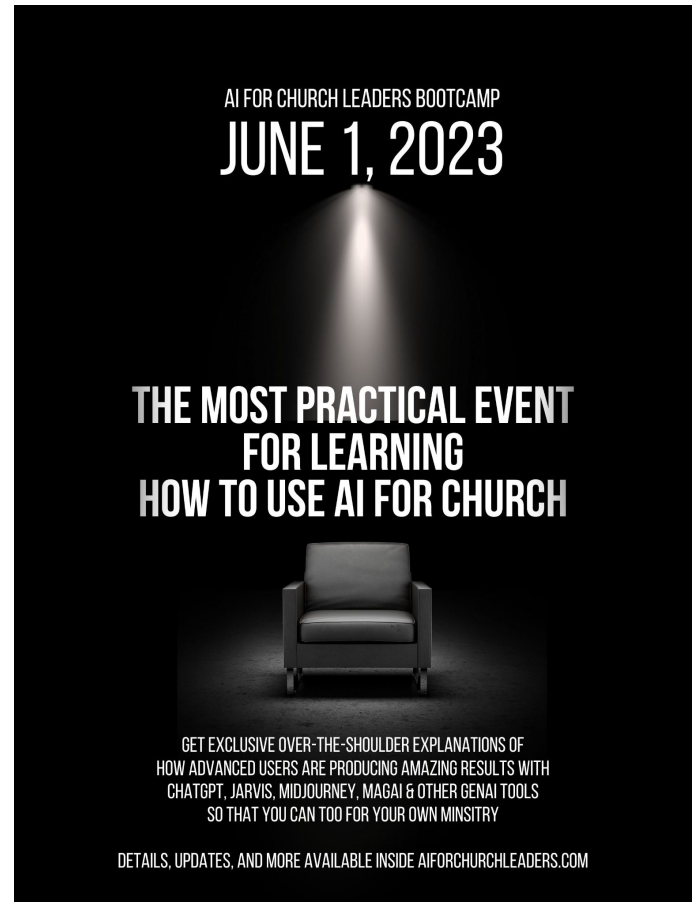

A Handful Of Key Takeaways From Our Time With Kenny Jahng

We had a lot of fun with Kenny ... or as Tim called him, “The Bishop Of AI,” while leaning into a fun and energetic conversation about how to use AI in the ministry context. Here are some takeaways from the conversation.

- You’re not going to just take what generative AI produces and hit copy/paste without any editing. Kenny’s advice is to think of AI as a seminary student intern. It doesn’t get



everything right. You may have to go back and do more work with AI, suggesting revisions. It's a conversation. It's called a conversational chatbot for a reason. There should be a back-and-forth to refine whatever you are working on.

- Church leaders can use generative AI in so many ways at work. Craft marketing emails, write website copy, do research for your Sunday Sermons, refine the questions for your Small Group Guides, come up with snappy headlines for an upcoming event. However, we have to remember that AI isn't a brain. It doesn't have human emotions and feelings. In the church context, it can't care, it can't think on its own, and it can't pastor. Those are 3 things you can't delegate to AI.
- A lot of people are suffering from FOLO: Fear of Looming Obsolescence. But, the only people truly at risk are those who refuse to adapt and use AI. Those who appreciate its benefits and learn how to use this properly in their workflows can excel.
- You can't think of ChatGPT as a vending machine, where you push a couple buttons and candy pops out. What you feed it matters. That means the user needs to create a very thoughtful and thorough prompt. You can try using Kenny's **AAFTER** format.
 - A = Act like this (a bible scholar, a child, etc.)
 - A = Audience this is intended for (write this for a women's ministry group, high school class, etc.)
 - F = Format (is it a 500 word article, a tweet, an email)
 - T= Task (tell the chatbot exactly what you want it to do / write about)
 - E = Evidence (request the evidence or context needed)
 - R = Restrictions (tell the chatbot what you do NOT want included).
- We need to consider that there are potential risks and unintended consequences of using AI in pastoral work. Kenny advises against overreliance on AI. We don't want to put too much trust in AI, because we have to remember that there is no humanity in it. ChatGPT doesn't think, it predictively figures out appropriate outputs. But, it's so good at what it does, that it's simulating human thought and we don't want to be deceived by that.
- There are countless AI tools you can use to write copy, create graphics, build powerpoint presentations and so much more. Here is Kenny's Top 5 list of tools for those just getting started.

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DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Continue the conversation! Here are questions to ask yourself and your team to help your church thrive. We hope Church Changer will inspire you to put into practice what we discuss each month!

1. Are you and your colleagues on staff using AI? Have a conversation about how you're currently using AI, what tools are most helpful, and where you're seeing success. Kenny points out that many people are using AI at work, but few are talking about it.

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4. What are some of the ethical questions around AI that you are currently wrestling with? Do you see any potential risks and unintended consequences of working with AI?

5. Traditionally, the church is slow to adopt new processes and technologies. Here's an opportunity to start using AI for our benefit. Are you open to being an early adopter?
